It's why your UU Service Committee prioritizes funding women-led organizations that are transforming communities in places all over the globe.

- In Nicaragua, where **Fundación Entre Mujeres** operates women's cooperatives to ensure self-sufficiency, food security, and economic stability.
- In Honduras, where **Foro de Mujeres por la Vida** defends survivors of gender-based violence, investigates femicide, and advocates for women's rights.
- In Thailand, where refugees from Burma seeking safety can connect to **Kachin Women's Association** Thailand for protection and care.
